**NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL**

**CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR AN INTERNATIONAL COURSE ON EMERGENCY  
MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE VICTIMS OF CHEMICAL INCIDENTS  
SVETLAYA ROSHCHA, BELARUS  
11 – 14 JUNE 2018**

1. On behalf of the Government of Belarus and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States to nominate participants for an international course on emergency medical assistance for the victims of chemical incidents, including those involving chemical-warfare agents, which will be held in Svetlaya Roshcha, Belarus, from 11 to 14 June 2018.
2. The course is related to assistance and protection against chemical weapons under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter “the Convention”), and will be jointly organised by the Government of Belarus and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter “the Secretariat”) at the International Rescuers Training Centre of the University of Civil Protection, Belarus.
3. The course, which will focus on pre-hospital care for chemical casualties, has been designed primarily for specialised paramedics, representatives of emergency services, and scene officers involved in providing pre-hospital care for chemical casualties and mitigation of the consequences of chemical incidents; applicants from institutions that deal with disaster medicine will also be considered. The course will be particularly valuable for professionals and managers who work in the field of medical countermeasures to chemical emergencies, and who have a background in the medical aspects of emergency response to incidents involving chemical weapons and other toxic chemicals.
4. The participants will be provided with an overview of the nature of chemical-warfare agents and other toxic chemicals and their effects. The course will enable paramedics and medical responders to gain an understanding of operating in a contaminated area and providing first aid to chemical casualties while wearing individual protective equipment. It will also provide an opportunity to discuss problems that they may encounter when participating in response operations to chemical incidents, including medical countermeasures in the event of a chemical attack during a mass-gathering event. The course, which will include both theoretical lectures and a practical component, will focus on pre-hospital care for patients exposed to toxic chemicals and on dealing with mass casualties, and will also facilitate the exchange of information and experiences regarding assistance and protection under Article X of



the Convention. The provisional programme for the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note.

5. Given the purpose of the course and its medical focus and technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected, and should have a background in pre-hospital emergency care, emergency medicine, and protection against chemical weapons and other toxic chemicals, and should belong to national emergency-response agencies and other institutions involved in dealing with chemical-related incidents. In addition, participants should be physically fit and be able to wear individual protective gear during the practical sessions.
6. All activities during the course will be conducted in English and no interpretation services of any kind will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good command of the English language, both written and oral.
7. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Belarus.
8. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, medical insurance, accommodation and meals, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. The course materials and equipment will be provided by the Belarusian side, at no cost to the participants. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
9. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 10 June 2018, and to depart no later than Friday, 15 June 2018. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel arrangements and to inform the Secretariat accordingly.
10. Interested applicants are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all contact details, including an email address. Completed forms should be sent, along with an endorsement letter from the National Authority or their Permanent Representation and a brief curriculum vitae, to the Director, International Cooperation and Assistance Division, copy to the Assistance and Protection Branch, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands.
