**NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT**

**CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE  
FOURTH REGIONAL MEETING OF NATIONAL AUTHORITIES  
OF STATES PARTIES IN AFRICA  
DAR-ES-SALAAM, TANZANIA  
16 AND 17 OCTOBER 2006**

1. On behalf of the Government of Tanzania and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, the Director-General wishes to invite National Authorities to submit nominations for the fourth regional meeting of National Authorities of States Parties in Africa, which will be held in Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania, on 16 and 17 October 2006.
2. At its Tenth Session, the Conference of the States Parties adopted a decision on follow-up to the plan of action regarding the implementation of Article VII obligations. The decision strongly encourages States Parties that have yet to fulfil their Article VII obligations “to avail themselves of assistance that is offered, to consult with the Secretariat, and to provide it with details, as appropriate, of their assistance requirements, including as regards putting into place their national implementation plans, as soon as possible and preferably by the end of 2005, with a view to preparing the ground for effective support by the Secretariat and/or States Parties during 2006”. (C-10/DEC.16, dated 11 November 2005).
3. The meeting will also serve as a forum in which representatives of National Authorities can confer with each other, with Secretariat staff, and with resource persons who have been invited to the meeting, in order to identify what further steps, if any, each State Party needs to take in order to implement its Article VII obligations. The programme for the meeting includes the following items:
  - (a) a review of the requirements of Article VII of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter “the Convention”);
  - (b) a review of, and comments on, national requests for and offers of implementation support, with particular regard to the establishment and running of a National Authority and the drafting of implementing legislation;



- (c) discussion of a detailed implementation-support plan for the region;
  - (d) bilateral meetings with Secretariat staff and with resource persons;
  - (e) improving the quality of declarations;
  - (f) the provisions of the Convention on the field of trade in chemicals, and efforts to create an integrated system; and
  - (g) provisions on the import and export of scheduled chemicals, and the training of customs officials in this connection.
4. Nominees should actually be involved in the national implementation of the Convention. Participants from each State Party represented at the meeting will be expected to make presentations in each of the following areas:
- (a) the status of implementation of the Convention in the State Party in question, including as regards the designation or establishment of a National Authority, and the status of national implementing legislation or administrative measures;
  - (b) any problems encountered in these areas, and any support required to address them;
  - (c) what offers of support, and in which areas of expertise, the State Party can make to other States Parties in the region, as well as any conditions for such offers, and the dates on which the support will be available;
  - (d) efforts of National Authorities to implement the provisions of the Convention on imports and exports; and
  - (e) training that National Authorities have provided to customs personnel.
5. The provisional programme for the meeting is included as Annex 1 to this Note.
6. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of representatives of National Authorities and of those involved in drafting national implementing legislation. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, meals, and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. The Secretariat will also arrange and pay for accommodation for sponsored participants. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to indicate that as soon as possible, so that the Secretariat does not incur hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation it has not arranged.
7. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most-economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for

the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, participants are expected to arrive **no earlier than Sunday, 15 October 2006**, and to depart **no later than Wednesday, 18 October 2006**. The Secretariat's agreement is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the meeting or that result from changes to travel arrangements it has not authorised. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation at reduced rates.

8. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Tanzania
9. All activities during the workshop will be conducted in English, with interpretation into French. All participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of one of these languages.
10. Interested National Authorities are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all the contact details it requests. All nominations must be received by the Secretariat **no later than 20 August 2006**. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to register at the meeting.
